### **New sensory trail launched**



A new sensory trail has opened at our Sutton Farm site in Rochford. It was launched during a special event that welcomed community members, the people we support, volunteers and funders who helped bring the project to life.

Created with inclusivity in mind, the trail is designed for autistic adults and people with learning disabilities to encourage movement, exploration and connection with nature.

With funding from Active Essex and Ford, and support from dedicated volunteers, the trail now links our Gowlands and Roots & Shoots gardens, Along the route, visitors can explore sensory stations, a colourful painted path with activity prompts, and calming plants that promote relaxation and well-being.

The people we support also have opportunities to get involved in maintaining the space, helping them build skills and confidence through hands-on horticulture.

Hamelin Chair of Trustees Graham Woodham praised everyone involved and said the project was a proud achievement for the charity.

### A safe space to share

We know how important it is to listen to the people we support. Following the sad passing of our dear friend Christopher who was a member of our Billeriay community for many years, the people we support wanted a meaningful way to express their thoughts and emotions. Some found it hard to talk about how they were feeling, while others simply didn't know where to start.

In response, our community came together and suggested a 'share box', a safe and supportive space where anyone can write down their worries, memories, dreams or feelings. It has quickly become a powerful way for people to feel heard, to know they are not alone and to connect with others who may be feeling the same.

The first messages placed in the share box were full of love and remembrance for Christopher. He was a much loved member of our Hamelin family, known for his passion for music, especially ABBA, his politeness and his fondness for the Isle of Wight. He had been attending Hamelin for many years and his warmth and kindness left a lasting impression on all of us.



The share box is more than just a place to put words, it is a reminder of the strength of our community and the importance of listening, understanding and supporting one another. Christopher's memory lives on not only in our hearts but in the way his friends chose to honour him, by creating a space where everyone can be seen, heard and supported.

# **Celebrating Hamelin's heroes**

Hamelin held its annual volunteer celebration earlier this month to recognise those who give their time to help others in our community.

Held at Little Channels in Chelmsford, the event brought together around 30 volunteers from Hamelin's services across Essex. The day was an opportunity to say thank you, reflect on the impact of volunteering and connect with others.

Guests enjoyed a three-course lunch, lively conversation and a values-based workshop exploring what it means to be part of the Hamelin community. The session focused on the charity's core values - We are community, We enhance lives and We think differently, with volunteers sharing personal experiences and ideas on how these values come to life in their roles. A visual facilitator captured the discussions through live illustration, creating a colourful and engaging snapshot of the day.


# **Ability Works builds skills**

### **Gaynor's marathon success**

Fresh from running the London Marathon, Hamelin supporter Gaynor Walton visited our Billericay centre to share her inspiring journey with the people we support. During a lively Q&A session, she spoke about her training, the emotional highs and lows of the race, and what motivated her to complete the 26.2 miles

Gaynor's visit was recorded for Radio Hamelin, an exciting new project led by the people we support, which will feature interviews, music and stories. Her talk included everything from race-day nerves to post-run recovery, and she praised the thoughtful questions she was asked.

After a decade away from marathon running. Gaynor raised an incredible £3.371 for Hamelin, tackling the race in 22°C heat and drawing strength from the people the charity supports. She said thoughts of their resilience helped her push through the toughest moments, especially ground mile 18.

The visit gave everyone the chance to celebrate her achievement and show their appreciation. Gaynor's determination and generosity have made a lasting impact. She is not just a marathon finisher, but a true Hamelin hero.
